Deciphering FamilySearch Catalog Entries

Questions:

1. What should I search for to find records for Navarre, Florida?
2. Which towns in Santa Rosa County have unique record collections of their own?
3. Where would you find genealogies of the Lockwood Family of Norwalk, Connecticut?
4. There is a book titled *Lockwood genealogy : some of the descendants of Robert and Susannah Norman Lockwood, of Norwalk, Connecticut*. How many different ways can you find this book? Try to locate it using the Keyword Search, the Surname Search, the Place Search. (This is a lot harder than it should be.)
5. How many items about Lockwoods in Norwalk are available online? (*Hint: use filters in the left side-bar.*)
6. What happens when you click “Add” in the far right margin of the list entry for *Lockwood genealogy : some of the descendants of Robert and Susannah Norman Lockwood, of Norwalk, Connecticut*?
7. What other family names are included in the *Lockwood genealogy*?
8. You do a Subject Search when you want to find Library of Congress subject headings, which include such items as the names of native races (Blacks, Chippewa Indians, and so forth), ethnicities (Swedes, Australians), occupations (painters, shipbuilders, and so forth), religious groups (Quakers, Baptists, and so forth), and languages (Danish, Japanese, and so forth). Explore a few categories that might be useful to your research.
9. Find the entry for the book *The Russian immigrant* by Jerome Davis. What is the nearest library with a copy of this book? (Look for the link “View this catalog record in WorldCat for other possible copy locations” on the catalog’s description page for the book.)
10. What does the FamilySearch Catalog abbreviation S.I. mean?
11. How many items in the subject “United States - Emigration and immigration” relate to “Business records and occupations” in the 1900s, and are available online? (use the sidebar filters below the search box)
 - a. What is the image number of the first Passport Correspondence 1900-1901?
